We are pleased to inform you that your firm has been certified as a Minority Business Enterprise (MBE) with the Washington Metropolitan Area Transportation Authority (WMATA), effective **August 19, 2021**. Your MBE certification record will be published in the District of Columbia Unified Certification Program (DCUCP) database directory along with any other certifications you may have with WMATA. You are currently certified in the following North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) Code(s):

If you wish to add to the list of approved NAICS Codes, you must first make such a request through our Supplier Portal and provide supporting documentation to [SBPOHotline@wmata.com](mailto:SBPOHotline@wmata.com). You are required to sign in using your User ID and Password. Then you must navigate to *Main Menu*, click on *Maintain Supplier Information*, click on *NAICS/SIC Code*.

If a change in the ownership, size, control or management of your firm has occurred, or occurs anytime during the certification period, you must notify WMATA of the change by completing and submitting a "Notice Regarding Change" statement to the Small Business Programs Office at [SBPOHotline@wmata.com](mailto:SBPOHotline@wmata.com) within 30 days of the occurrence of the change.

A firm is considered graduated from some or all of the areas of work grouped under the NAICS codes if its three-year average annual gross receipts or the average number of employees for the past 12 months exceeds the specific SBA threshold. If a firm exceeds any of the NAICS Code size standards, it is no longer certified as a Minority Business Enterprise under that specific Code. If a firm exceeds the size standards in all of its approved NAICS Codes, or the Personal Net Worth standard, it is no longer eligible to participate as a Minority Business Enterprise under WMATA's Program.


Your certification period expires two years from the initial date of certification, however, as stated above, a "Notice Regarding Change" must be submitted if there is a change in your firm's business circumstances.

Failure to notify WMATA of such changes within the 30-day timeframe will result in immediate actions to decertify your firm. Decertification will eliminate your firm's ability to be utilized and counted by prime contractors seeking to fulfill subcontracting requirements.

These MBE certification requirements apply separate and apart from any other certifications that your firm may currently hold with WMATA.
