We are pleased to inform you that your firm has been found eligible to continue its certification as a Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE)/Small Business Enterprise (SBE) with the District Of Columbia Unified Certification Program (DCUCP), effective **September 1, 2023**. DCUCP participants include the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority (WMATA) and the District of Columbia Department of Transportation (DDOT). **Your firm is subject to the requirements of the Disadvantaged Business Enterprise regulations, Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 26, as amended and all laws of this jurisdiction applicable to the transaction of business.** You are currently certified in the following North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) Code(s):

If you wish to add to the list of approved NAICS Codes, you must first make such request in writing with supporting documentation to the UCP agency from which the original certification was received. For WMATA firms, please submit your request to the [SBPO hotline@wmata.com](mailto:SBPO hotline@wmata.com). If your firm has been certified by the Interstate Certification process, you must submit your request to your home state.

Your certification does not automatically expire. As a certified DBE, you are required to submit

an annual "No Change"/ "Notice Regarding Change" statement, attesting to your continued status as a "socially and economically disadvantaged individual". Please log into WMATA's supplier portal at <https://www.wmata.com/business/procurement/vendor-resources.cfm> to upload your firm's current business and personal income tax returns and your "No Change"/ "Notice Regarding Change" statement.

A comprehensive review of the firm is conducted every three (3) years from the initial date of certification and over the lifespan of the firm's certification. You must login in to WMATA's supplier portal at <https://www.wmata.com/business/procurement/vendor-resources.cfm> to complete and submit the requisite form to update your certification record. The review and supporting documentation should be submitted every three (3) years on or before the certification anniversary.

If a change in the ownership, control or management of your firm has occurred, you must complete and submit a "Notice Regarding Change" statement within 30 days of the occurrence of the change. Failure to report changes could result in decertification proceedings.

A firm is considered graduated in a specific NAICS Code if the firm exceeds the size standard in any approved NAICS Code under that specific NAICS Code. If a firm exceeds the size standards in its approved NAICS Codes or the established Personal Net Worth standard, it is no longer eligible to participate as a Disadvantaged Business Enterprise under Federal Regulation 49 CFR Part 26.
